

# Twilight Socks

*Yeah – finally done and happy with the chart! This one is mostly up to you, a “Choose Your Own Adventure” sock, if you will. I used Louet Gems fingering weight in black natural and red, size US 1 dpns and 4 homemade, cardboard bobbins for the intarsia work. I leave the actual sock pattern up to you, use an old friend or a new favorite and work this little chart on the calf. I’ve written the instructions for toe-ups but it’s seriously easy to reverse for a cuff down.*

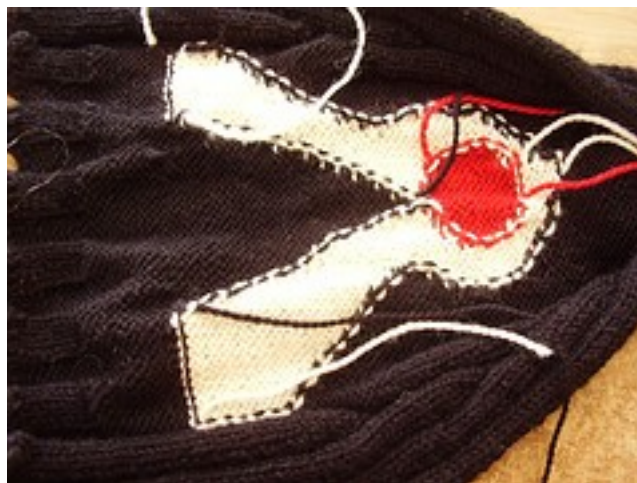
The chart portion of the leg is NOT worked in the round. *I repeat:* The chart portion of the leg is in intarsia and is worked flat – NOT in the round.

Work the toe-up pattern of your choice

Work the toe and length of foot to fit the wearer. Work the heel of your choice and mark the center of the front of your sock, this is where you will separate the round and begin to work the leg flat



Work two inches in MC flat but continuing on multiple needles until the work has gained enough ease to move it to one straight or circular needle. Mark your center with a stitch marker. The chart is worked over 40 sts and 50 rows.



Work one inch in the MC after finishing the chart. (you may place the stitches back on multiple needles at this point and rejoin into the round or finish the sock flat. Work 2 inches of 4x4 rib around the entire sock. Cast off, weave in the internal intarsia ends and seam the open leg.



These would also look great as wrist warmers!

I don't have a finished pic of the sock – cankles are not so attractive - so I'm counting on those of you out there with great gams to work 'em up and show off some pics!
